TWO ANSWERS TO TWO QUESTIONS FROM OUR DIRECTOR, JESSICA CADIENTE

Q: The library has continued to offer many programs and services to the community throughout the Covid pandemic. If you could only

select one accomplishment, which would it be?

A: SBPL immediately got to work to look for ways to positively support our community during this challenging time. We never missed a beat. We transitioned to virtual programs, launched SBPL Delivers! and then transitioned to Side Walk Service and then ultimately to Grab N' Go inside all locations. We balanced the safety of our team and the needs of the community in every decision. When every other public counter was closing, our library team showed up. Safety was always first, but they showed up to serve and in many instances showed our community a better way to live, work and help others. We are a team at SBPL and so it is not any one person or program but the whole that makes the impact. Being a member of the SBPL team is what makes me most proud. Q: If you were given unlimited funds to design your budget, what would you like to see the library offer?

A: Services, collections, programs and classes are only limited by staff capacity and money. The more we have the more we can do and if we could design our own budget we would be unstoppable! The Library does all it can to fill gaps in formal education at all stages of life. I would love to see an expansion of our Adult Education Division so that we could help people obtain their educational goals more quickly and help more people at the same time. That being said, early education and the need for kindergarten readiness classes also continues to increase and I would love to see us be able to support more in this area as well. Ultimately, our budget priorities are driven by community need and so this will ebb and flow as our community changes.

We have recently begun inviting local businesses to become Friends of the Library. Deckers, Santa Barbara Pet Hospital, the Book Den and one anonymous donor have joined thus far. The library offers several programs that help prepare people for the workplace and support our business community including SPBPL Works, One Million Cups, English Conversation Groups, Vets Connect and Adult Literacy. FINANCIAL REPORT

There is a lot of belt-tightening going on in our community because of the pandemic, but our membership has been loyal in their support. Our fiscal year started on July 1, 2020, and the total income from membership renewals and new memberships, thus far, is \$14,378. The Year End Appeal brought in \$23,915, general donations, \$1,563, and our digital Storytelling Event raised \$3,362. Business memberships contributed \$2900. Three quarters of the library's wish list of \$65,000 has been paid, thanks to YOU! Because we are not able to hold fund-raising events, we hope you will contribute to this Spring Appeal so that we can make our last payment of the wish list in June.

LIBRARY ON THE GO!

Some of you may remember the old Book Mobile, but now the Santa Barbara Public Library will be adding a new mobile library branch with more than books for those with limited library access. They plan on being out and about sometime this summer. The library has done an impressive job in taking library programs and services out into the community the past few years including visits to local schools, senior living facilities, community events, and Storywalk in the Park, but this will add one more opportunity for people to avail themselves of learning experiences.

The library director, Jessica Cadiente and the staff are always looking for ways to support early literacy and provide library services to underserved residents not able to visit the Carpinteria, Eastside, Montecito, or Santa Barbara locations. The van will be equipped with technology as well as a browsing collection of popular books. The staff will offer Stay and Play programming for children and caregivers, and SBPL's Works! a program which helps job seekers find jobs and build workforce readiness skills. They will also help people who want to learn more about using their mobile devices

The Women's Fund of Santa Barbara provided a \$100,000 grant, which allowed the Library to move forward with the project. The Santa Barbara Public Library Foundation also contributed some funding.

Getting the Van ready to become the new mobile branch of the Santa Barbara Public Library! The van will contain books to browse through and technologies which will provide a wide range of programs and workshops for the local visitors!
