

Book Review:

The Bletchley Riddle, by Ruta Sepetys and Steve Sheinkin

Two award-winning and bestselling authors, Ruta Sepetys and Steve Sheinkin, have collaborated on this middle-grade (grades five through eight) historical adventure/mystery novel set against the backdrop of Britain's WWII top-secret codebreaking factory at Bletchley Park. It is at Bletchley Park where we find siblings, nineteen-year-old Jakob Novis and his fourteen-year-old sister Lizzie, in the spring/summer of 1940. Jakob has joined the factory to try and help solve the Nazi's Enigma code, while Lizzie is on a secret mission to discover the truth about their mother's disappearance in Poland at the beginning of the war.

This is a well-researched, fast-paced, thrilling, and suspenseful story told in alternating chapters by the siblings (Sheinkin writing the Jakob chapters and Sepetys writing Lizzie). If you enjoy puzzles, riddles, ciphers, and codes, oh my,



you will love this book. In discussing the book, Sheinkin writes, "And on top of the codes that are part of the story, there are a lot of little riddles woven into the book, small puzzles here and there—nothing you have to stop and solve, but some readers may want to take a second look. It's all hidden in plain sight. Even those strings of Enigma-looking ciphers on the cover hold hidden messages."

As a retired high school teacher-librarian, I still read middle-grade and Young Adult (YA) books, like this excellent book. Please check out these three Ruta Sepetys historical fiction, YA and adult crossover books, *Out of the Easy, Between Shades of Gray*, and *I Must Betray You*, as well as these two nonfiction Steve Sheinkin history books, *The Port Chicago 50: Disaster, Mutiny*, and the *Fight for Civil Rights, and Undefeated: Jim Thorpe and the Carlisle Indian School Football Team*.

Lauren Trujillo – A Rising Star

When Lauren Trujillo was hired as Director of the Santa Barbara Public Library Foundation in 2016, she made a point of reaching out to the Friends to develop a collaborative relationship between the two organizations. She attends our monthly board meetings and keeps us up to date on the activities of the Library Foundation. Some of us serve on the Foundation's Advocacy Committee, and we recently held a book sale at the Plaza Palooza. Although we focus on different areas, we both work towards financially supporting the library to make it one of the best community resources Santa Barbara has to offer.

Lauren has worked with several nonprofits and organizations in Santa Barbara, including the Isla Vista Memorial Project, the Santa Barbara Mission Archive-Library, the Santa Barbara Trust for Historic Preservation, and the Santa Barbara Historical Museum. Additionally, she sits on the boards for the Women's Fund of Santa

Barbara, United for Libraries, Women's Literary Voices, the Northside Optimist Club, Association for Fundraising Professionals, and Environmental Defense Center, and is a member of the Junior League of Santa Barbara.

Lauren is also currently nominated as one of the finalists for the Santa Barbara Young Professionals' awards.

The Friends have lots of favorites about Lauren, but what first comes to mind is her ready and sincere laugh. If there's a problem to be solved, she'll say, "Think of it as an opportunity." Who doesn't want to be around someone who is enthusiastic, technically savvy, giving and adorable in every outfit she wears. We value Lauren's many strengths and natural generosity. Just this week, she helped one of our board members solve a problem with eTapestry, which is a cloud-based fundraising and donor management software for nonprofits. Thank you, Lauren!


Santa Barbara Public Library Volunteer Opportunities
